Illawarra Shoalhaven Local Health District COVID-19 cases update

▲ 130 confirmed COVID-19 cases in the Illawarra and Shoalhaven ▲

For the 24 hour period to 8pm last night, there were 130 new COVID-19 cases recorded for the Illawarra Shoalhaven Local Health District. Details are as follows:

- 86 cases from Wollongong Local Government Area (LGA)
- 19 cases from Shellharbour LGA
- 16 case from Shoalhaven LGA
- 9 cases from Kiama LGA

There have been 3620 total community acquired COVID-19 cases reported since 16 June 2021, when the first case in this outbreak was reported (cases not necessarily acquired within the Local Health District).

As at 8pm, 25 December there were 15 patients in hospital in the District as a result of COVID-19 (please note, this total may include patients who are no longer COVID-19 positive).

Below we have provided postcodes for confirmed cases as a guide to alert the community who live in these areas that COVID-19 may be circulating in their suburb and surrounds. We do this to ensure all residents within the postcode know they need to be extra vigilant when leaving their home, when monitoring for symptoms and getting tested if they feel unwell.

Individual suburb breakdowns are not provided as it does not accurately reflect where cases may have been during their infectious period.
