Illawarra Shoalhaven Local Health District COVID-19 cases update

△ 915 confirmed COVID-19 cases in the Illawarra and Shoalhaven **△**

For the 24 hour period to 8pm last night, there were 915 new COVID-19 cases recorded for the Illawarra Shoalhaven Local Health District. Details are as follows:

- 505 cases from Wollongong Local Government Area (LGA)
- 168 cases from Shellharbour LGA
- 95 cases from Shoalhaven LGA
- 147 cases from Kiama LGA

There have been 11,590 total community acquired COVID-19 cases reported since 16 June 2021 (cases not necessarily acquired within the Local Health District).

As at 8pm, 6 January there were 49 patients in hospital in the District as a result of COVID-19 (please note, this total may include patients who are no longer COVID-19 positive).

Below we have provided postcodes for confirmed cases as a guide to alert the community who live in these areas that COVID-19 may be circulating in their suburb and surrounds. We do this to ensure all residents within the postcode know they need to be extra vigilant when leaving their home, when monitoring for symptoms and getting tested if they feel unwell.

Individual suburb breakdowns are not provided as it does not accurately reflect where cases may have been during their infectious period.
