First Step Program

The First Step Program is a combined initiative of the Commonwealth and State governments. The primary goals of the program are:



Reduce the incidence
 of HIV/AIDS & Hep C

HIV/AIDS & Hep C Information

HIV – The Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) attacks the immune system – the body's defence against disease. People who have the virus are said to be HIV positive. Because HIV can live in the body for years without obvious effects, many people with HIV remain feeling healthy. Some people will later go on to develop AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome).

Hep C – Is a particularly virulent form of Hepatitis. Many people will have no symptoms, while others may feel tired, nauseous and experience abdominal pains. For every 100 people infected by the virus 80 will become carriers. Of these 20 will go on to develop long term inflammation of the liver. A number of these people will eventually go on to suffer cirrhosis of the liver and/or liver cancer.

How the viruses are transmitted.

HIV (the AIDS virus) is spread by semen (cum), vaginal fluids or blood passing from a person with HIV into the bloodstream of another person. The major ways HIV is passed on are through the sharing of needles and syringes,



sex.

Ensure your health — never share any injecting equipment. Always practice safe Hep C is primarily spread by infected blood passing from person to person through blood borne activities such as, sharing of needles and syringes, razors and toothbrushes, or unsafe tattooing practices. There is little evidence of sexual transmission of the virus

First Step — How it works

Clean Needles & Syringes

Provided on the understanding, that once used they will be returned for safe disposal.

<u>Condoms</u>

Provided on request.

<u>Information</u>

The First Step Program has available to everyone a wide range of pamphlets, journals and booklets on HIV, Hep C, general health, welfare and legal issues.

Education

Provided to clients regarding safe sex and drug use behaviour practices. First Step also provides formal seminars on request to the general public, professional and community groups.

<u>Support</u>

Available to all clients. This solution focused approach allows the individual to explore issues regarding drug use and prompts action for drug cessation.

<u>Referral</u>

Extensive liaison list provides staff with the latest information for referral to relevant groups and services in and outside the Illawarra & Shoalhaven (eg. Methadone Programs, Drug Rehabilitation Services, Narcotics Anonymous).
